I want to apply for WFFA, what are some of my responsibilities?

Parents must make sure children get regular medical check-ups and immunizations.

Parents must make sure school-aged children attend school.

Parents must make sure teen parents live at home and stay in school.

Parents must cooperate with child support enforcement efforts.

Parents with children over the age of one must participate in a 35-hour-per-week Mutual Responsibility Contract.

Work First Family Assistance (WFFA) is North Carolina's TANF (Temporary Assistance for Needy Families) plan to help families move off welfare and into employment. To help families, WFFA provides employment services, supportive services and *time limited* cash assistance to families with children under age 18 who meet income and resource guidelines.

Bringing the following items will aid in the processing of your application:

- Identification, including birth certificates, for everyone in your home
- Social Security Cards
- Proof of your residence - (lease, rent or mortgage receipts, utility bill with your address on it)
- Proof of Income - (Pay stubs, SSI, Social Security, Pensions, Other)
- Bank Accounts - (Recent bank statements)
- Utility Bills - (Gas, Electric, Phone, Water, and Sewer, etc.)
- Name and phone number of at least 1 person who can verify who lives with you
